Welcome

The UNESCO Chair Global Health & Education, International Union for Health Promotion and Education (IUHPE), EHESP School of Public Health and Réseau Francophone International Pour la Promotion de la Sante (RÉFIPS) are welcoming you to the third edition of the Global Community Health Annual workshop and are providing you with a sneak preview of our workshop.

The Global Community Health Annual workshop provides a space where community health and health promotion practitioners and policy makers can improve their skills and where researchers can gain in capacities to conduct community-based participatory research.

The theme for the 2023 edition is 'Sustainable community health: practice-based solutions for today's challenges'. There will be a particular focus on stakeholder engagement and mobilizing communities as an essential step in community health. Each workshop day will focus on a different subtheme (food security, mental health, environmental health) with practical examples of how to meaningfully engage stakeholders in work relating to these subthemes.

Format of the workshop

The online workshop will start on Tuesday 13 June 2023 and will end on Thursday 15 June 2023.

The workshop consists of lectures, case studies and time for questions, pre-recorded interviews and community health hubs. It uses an interactive format ensuring **active participation**.

- Lectures and case studies explore the theoretical background and research findings related to the main workshop theme of each day. The case studies describe concrete examples of how to apply community health in real life. There will be time to ask **questions** to the presenters.
- **'Voices from the field'** are pre-recorded interviews with practitioners, researchers and policy makers talking about their work in the field of community health.
- **Community health hubs** are small working groups that will reflect on the lectures and case studies. In your community health hub you will have the opportunity to share experiences, build your regional and global networks and work with other group members on the assignment. Based on your language preference and participation in Block 1 or Block 2 you will be assigned to your community health hub.
- **Assignment:** part of the work in the community health hubs is to make an assignment. You will receive more information about the assignment in due course. Completing the assignment will lead to a certificate for your participation in the Community Health Workshop.

Language

The online presentations are in the English language. We do not want language to be a barrier for participation. For the 2023 edition we can already confirm we will provide interpreting into French. Participants can volunteer to do this work during the workshop.
